OVERVIEW: Pennsylvania recently established three Centers of Excellence in Public Service Psychiatry to recruit and retain psychiatrists who will work in the public sector. To attain this goal, the Centers will organize a network of providers to collaborate in preparing psychiatrists to serve as leaders in the recovery-oriented transformation of our behavioral health care system. Please join us to explore successful practices and creative approaches for attracting psychiatrists to the public sector. The conference will foster the exchange of ideas to guide the Centers for Public Psychiatry in their mission. National and state leaders in public psychiatry will keynote the conference with their views on improving access, integrating public and academic institutions, and training psychiatrists to work in the public sector. In breakout sessions, conference participants will brainstorm new ideas for recruiting psychiatrists, developing a public service provider network, and addressing other crucial transformation issues. The conference will serve as a first step to create a framework for collaboration among the Centers, providers, consumers, and other stakeholders.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

A representation of all stakeholders involved in public behavioral health service systems. Psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, nurses, service coordinators, counselors, consumers, family members, advocates will be able to provide valuable input.

OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of the program, participants should be able to:

1. Identify potential roles and goals for network participants in the Centers for Public Service Psychiatry.
2. Identify the types of relationships among all stakeholders needed for improving the quality of behavioral health care.
3. Characterize the knowledge, skills, and experience psychiatrists must have to provide leadership and advocacy in the public sector.
4. Identify the range of educational needs and resources that exist throughout the behavioral health care system.

Featured Speakers:

David Cutler, MD – Medical Director, Multnomah County Oregon Department of Human Services, Mental Health and Addiction Services Division.

Currently Dr. Cutler serves as the Medical Director of The Mental Health and Addiction Services Division of The Multnomah County Oregon Department of Human Services. He is also a Staff Psychiatrist at Tillamook Family Counseling in Tillamook, Oregon. He was a professor of Psychiatry at the Oregon Health and Sciences University from 1977 to 2005. Formerly he was Director of the Public Psychiatry Training Program, Department of Psychiatry at Oregon Health and Sciences University (1985-2004). There Dr. Cutler planned and led training for residents to work in community mental health centers and state hospitals, and implemented placements, seminars, examinations, supervision, and evaluations for residents. He performed similar functions at The Ohio State University Department of Psychiatry as a visiting professor in 2005 and 2006. From 1987-2005 he was Editor in Chief of *Community Mental Health Journal*. He has published dozens of articles and books on subjects ranging from training in public psychiatry, rural psychiatry, forensic psychiatry, to the role of support systems in the treatment of persons with severe mental illness. Dr. Cutler's career includes numerous consultation posts, editorial review boards, memberships on national and local task forces, advisory boards and committees. Dr. Cutler is a Distinguished Life Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association and has received numerous awards from NAMI and other national organizations.

Jules Ranz, MD- Director Public Psychiatry Fellowship, Columbia University

Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Columbia University Medical Center, Dr. Jules Ranz has been full time director of the Public Psychiatry Fellowship at NYS Psychiatric Institute/Columbia University Medical Center since 1992, having served as associate director of the Fellowship from 1987-92. There he has generated a highly successful recruitment process resulting in high quality applicants. Dr. Ranz has had a wide range of distinguished experience in public psychiatry since his residency training in nearly 40 years ago. He was in charge of residency training in an innovative three-year social and community psychiatry residency program, director of a model community service specializing in systems-oriented care of adults with severe and persistent mental illness and clinical director of an urban state psychiatric center. He has also published a number of articles based on the Fellowship and results of its alumni survey, showing that nearly all respondents work full time in the public sector; more than half hold management positions, and more than three-fourths hold academic appointments in medical schools in the area in which they are working as public psychiatrists. In 2007 Dr. Ranz was given the Award for Excellence in Administration by the New York Regional Chapter of the American Association of Psychiatric Administrators (AAPA).
